

IUG – Membership Fee Policy

The IUG Board has asked for a strategic policy regarding the annual IUG subscription fee and to formalise the relationship between the subscription fee and the minimum and maximum required financial reserves of the IUG.

Considering that:

- The board of the IUG makes an annual proposal for membership fees which is then put forward to the Meeting of Associates for approval.
- The present subscription fee is € 35,- per pilot.
- Organizations wishing to host an annual ISPO conference can (under certain conditions) apply for subsidies (financial support) from the IUG if needed.
- The Working Group may be required to hold more regular meetings, leading to higher expenses.
- A healthy organization generally has a minimum financial reserve equal to one year's annual turnover.
- The IUG is a non-profit organization and therefore a large sum of money in the bank is not desirable.
- The IUG requires a steady subscription fee without large annual fluctuations.

The IUG board has decided to:

Maintain the proposed subscription fee at € 35,- per pilot per year and will only revise the proposed fee upwards in case the reserve is less than € 40.000,- or downwards if the reserve is more than € 100.000,-.
